CLE on Ethics and Trafficking—Oct. 26

USCIS will begin exempting Forms I-539 from biometrics services beginning Oct. 1.

Beginning Oct. 1, we are exempting the \$85 biometric services fee as part of the application process for <u>Form I-539</u>, <u>Application to Extend/Change Nonimmigrant</u> Status.

Applicants **do not need to pay** the fee if their application is **postmarked Oct. 1 or later.** However, certain applicants who file Form I-539 prior to Oct. 1 will still be scheduled for an ASC appointment and should still attend.

In most cases, applicants will not be scheduled to attend a biometric services appointment. However, if USCIS determines that biometrics are required, the applicant will receive a notice with information about appearing for their biometric services appointment.

If an applicant mistakenly submits the biometric services fee and the payment is submitted separately from the Form I-539 fee, we will return the biometric services fee and accept the Form I-539.

If an applicant mistakenly submits the biometric services fee and the payment is combined with a paper-based Form I-539 filing fee, this is considered an incorrect filing and we will reject the Form I-539.

If an applicant mistakenly authorizes a credit card payment that combines the biometric services fee with the application fee, we will accept the application and only charge the application fee.
