Know Your Rights.

WHAT CAN I DO IF ICE Stay calm. Ask **STOPS ME ON THE STREET?** "Am I free to go?" If they say <u>yes</u>, walk away and say: I do not want to answer any questions. If they say <u>no</u>, say: I do not want to answer any questions. I want to speak to a lawyer.

What do I do if ICE is at my door?

You have the right to keep your door closed and to remain silent.

IMPORTANT: If you want to exercise your right to remain silent, tell ICE in any language:

<u>signed by a judge</u>.

What do I do if I'm pulled over while driving?

3. Refuse to answer any questions about your criminal or immigration history.

5. Ask if you are under arrest and leave if the answer is "no."


Pull over and show your driver's license.

If you're the passenger, remain silent and refuse to answer questions about your criminal or immigration history.

What do I do if ICE comes to my workplace?



ICE needs a warrant or permission to enter "<u>private</u>" or "<u>employees only</u>" spaces.

Know what space is private and who to call if ICE wants to enter.

• You have the right to remain silent when questioned by ICE.

Know Your Rights.



What do I do if I am detained by ICE?

You have the right to remain silent.

You have the right to not sign papers you don't understand or agree with.
