Community Forum to Educate the Public on President Obama's New Administrative Relief for Parents of U.S. Citizens and on Avoiding "Notario" Fraud

Pillsbury United Communities and the Advocates for Human Rights form a strong partnership to serve thousands of Minneapolis residents as President Obama's new immigration Administrative Relief program is set to help millions

Minneapolis, MN (Wed., Dec. 17, 2014)—Hundreds of people will gather this Saturday, December 20 to learn about President Obama's Deferred Action for Parental Accountability (DAPA) program which will grant administrative relief to millions around the country. The forum will be held at Waite House Community Center, 2320 13th Avenue S., Minneapolis.

Organized by Pillsbury United Communities and The Advocates for Human Rights, the forum will also warn people against predatory "notario" (fraud) which has been rampant across the state and taking advantage of immigrants. Sometimes families end up losing thousands of dollars to these "notarios" with the false pretense that they will help them move their case forward.

Pillsbury United Communities and The Advocates for Human Rights will also present information about their new initiative which will help thousands of Minneapolis residents by creating access to free legal assistance for DAPA applications and establishing four active sites throughout the city to serve as many as possible.
